Alternatives (save time, save money)

- Inquiry forms
 - Easy to create, data on the fly, customizable, sortable, filterable
- Export to Excel
 - Excel familiarity, ease of use, possibly no customization needed
- List pages
 - Sortable, filterable, able to view details
- Does another report already exist that is close?
 - Modification is easier than from scratch



So you need an actual report

- What you need
 - A good design
 - Visual Studio (you need a license for the DEV machine)
 - Visual Studio components installed for AX
 - Data setup in your DEV environment
- What you will create
 - Classes (Typically three: DP, Controller, Contract)
 - Tables
 - Queries
 - Menu items
 - Labels
 - SSRS reports
 - Dynamics AX Model project
 - Security Privilege



What makes a good design

- Knowing where the data comes from
 - Table/Fields
 - Form/Control paths
- A good example layout
 - You can use Excel to mimic the layout.
- Where should the report live? (menu location)
- What parameters are needed?
 - What defaulting should take place on the parameter form?
- Security
- "Header values" aka Labels



How long will this take?

- From a Stoneridge perspective, we usually estimate simple reports between 20-30 hours
- With complexity comes time and expense
 - Dimensions
 - Multiple designs
 - Header/lines/footer (think Sales Order, etc.)
 - Form reports (1099s, checks)
 - Data needed from multiple data sources (tables)
- It's not uncommon for a report to take 1-2 weeks to complete.



SSRS Report pieces

- Data provider class (DP) This supplies the data to the report
- Contract class Parameters for the report
- Controller Runs the report
- Temp table Holds the data for the report
- SSRS report The report design
- Visual studio project
- Menu item To be able to run the report from the UI
- Privilege To secure down the Menu item
